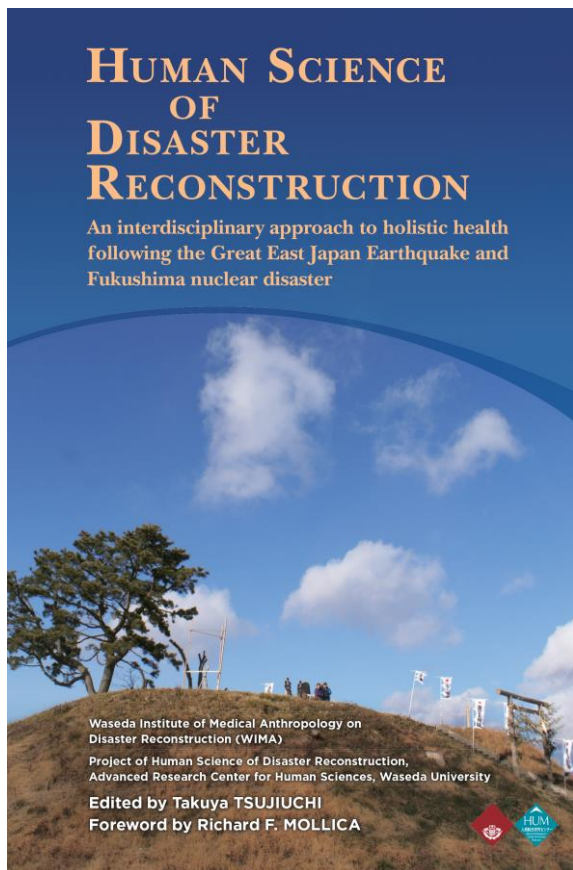


# Human Science of Disaster Reconstruction
